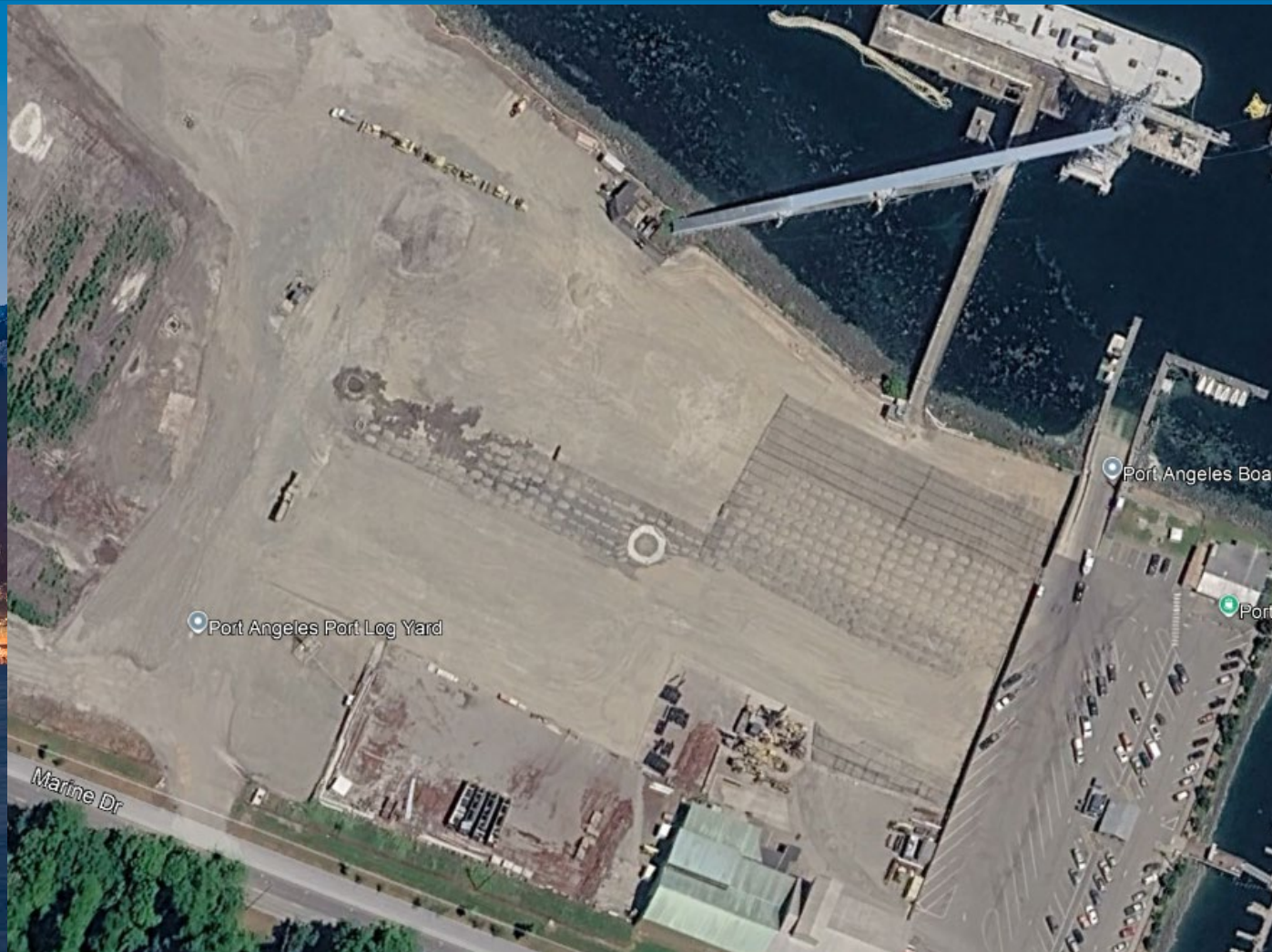

On behalf of the Port of Port Angeles, we are pleased to offer this letter of endorsement for Port Townsend Paper Corporation (PTPC) and its FY 2026 application to the United States Marine Highway (USMH) Grant Program under the Maritime Administration (MARAD). PTPC, the private owner of a paper mill and adjacent dock infrastructure in Port Townsend, Washington, is proposing a dock reconstruction project that will boost utilization of the M-5 Marine Highway Route.

As a designated sponsor of the M-5 Route since 2024, the Port of Port Angeles recognizes the necessity of marine highway services to address regional transportation challenges. The M-5 corridor, which spans the West Coast from Washington to California, presents significant opportunities for expansion. This is particularly true in the Puget Sound region, where landside congestion is increasing, and road infrastructure is under strain. On the Olympic Peninsula, where PTPC is located, the M-5 route also provides essential transportation and freight resilience to communities that lack rail.

PTPC's proposed project will expand and enhance marine highway transportation along the M-5 by restoring full gantry crane access to the 360ft cargo dock at the facility. The crane is used to unload PTPC's feedstock (woodchips) from barges. Today, only 26 feet of the dock are reachable by the crane due to structural deterioration, causing PTPC to move the barges along the dock rather than using the crane. This creates significant inefficiencies in PTPC's process, in addition to keeping barges occupied for longer than necessary and preventing them from meeting the demands of other shippers.

Reconstructing the dock and restoring full crane access will enable PTPC to work two barges at once, opening the facility to tandem towing and the associated fuel cost and time savings. The project is anticipated to increase barge calls from 84 to 144 per year and grow the total annual cargo tonnage by 77% to over 110,000 bone dry tons. Additionally, with increased capacity for barges, the facility would be capable of bringing in hog fuel, bark, and other wood residuals by water. Given the dock's limited capacity, these materials are currently transported to PTPC over already constrained roads, by truck.

The proposed project will allow PTPC to efficiently handle a broader range of cargo types at its dock, increase utilization of barge transportation, and provide needed cargo capacity on the Quimper Peninsula. The project will also result in shorter and more predictable turnaround times for barges, strengthening the entire regional maritime transportation network. These anticipated project outcomes will advance key goals of the USMH Program, including increased marine cargo capacity, reduced highway wear, and efficiency gains in a regionally significant industry.

This application presents a strategic opportunity to enhance regional maritime initiatives by making a targeted investment in an existing Marine Highway Transportation Service. The Port urges consideration of PTPC's FY2026 application to the USMH Program.

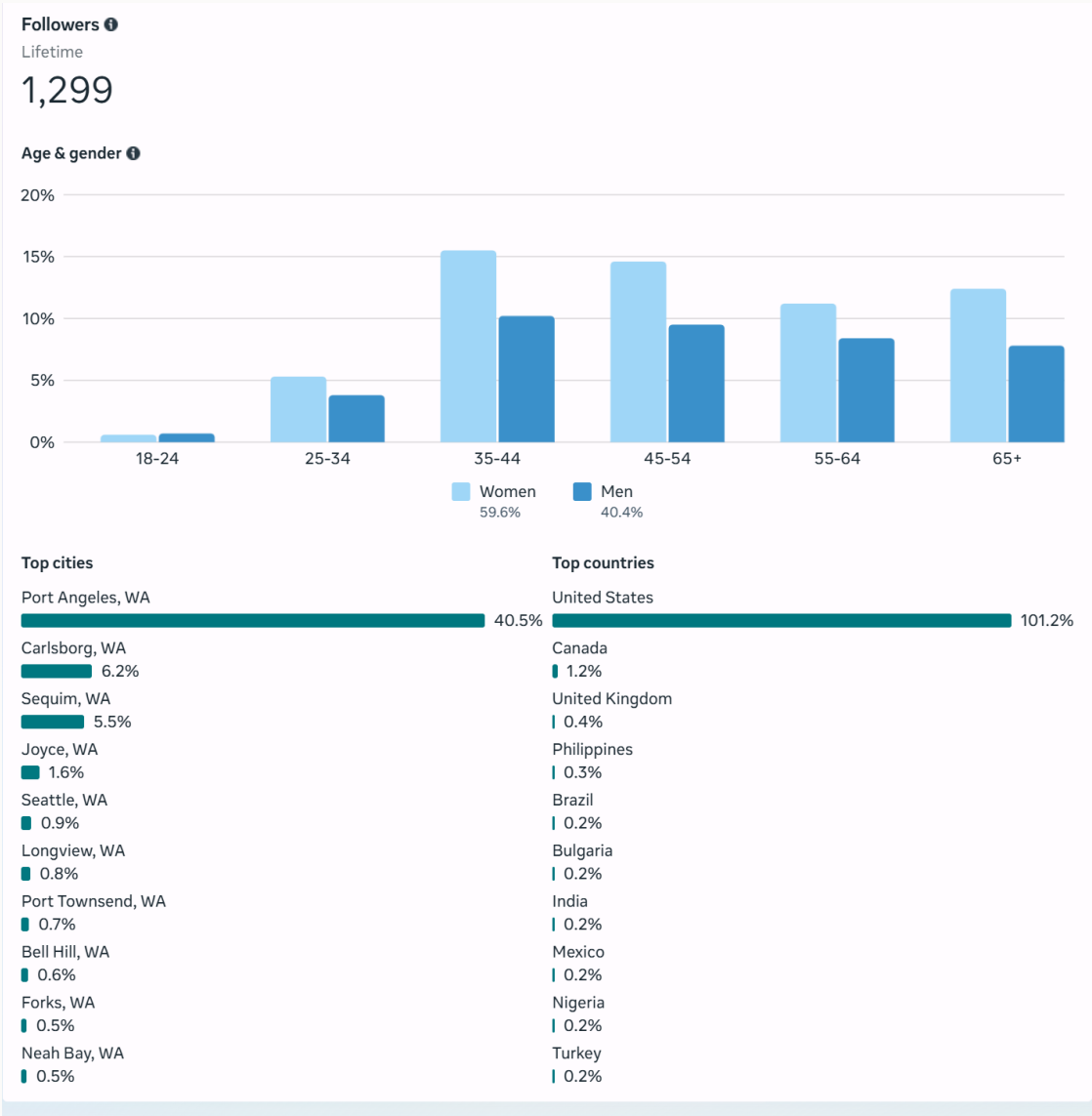

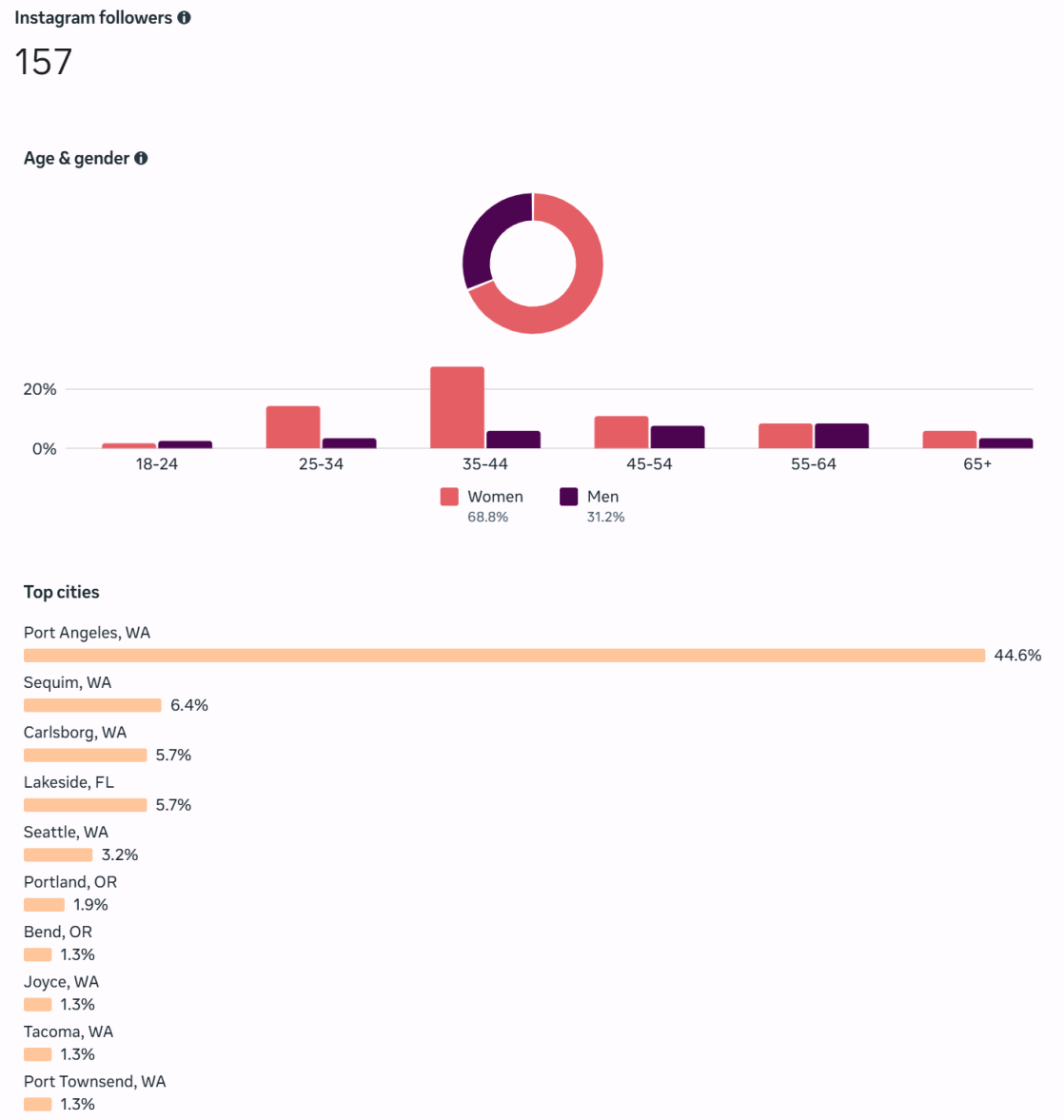

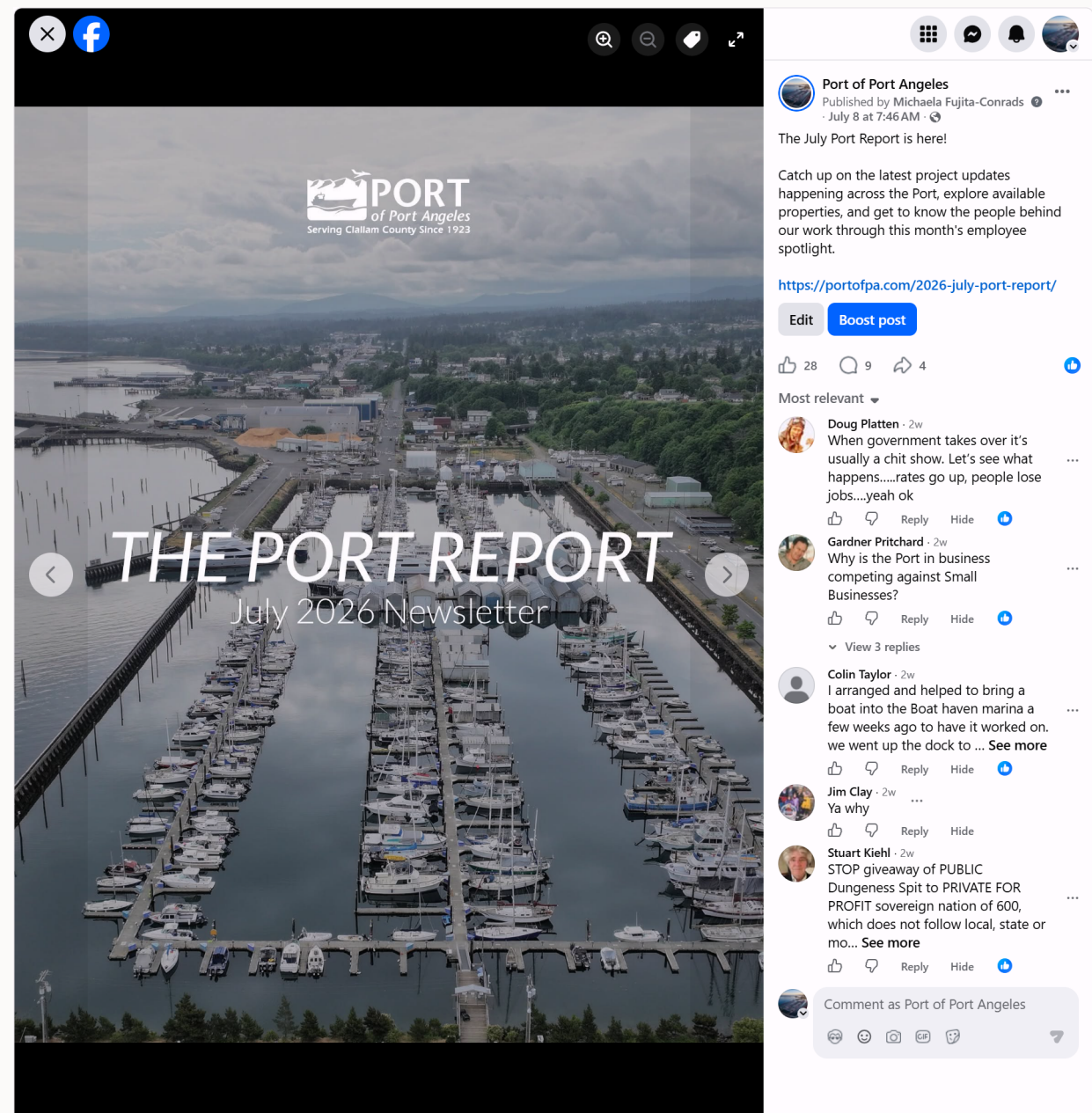
